

## TIMELINE OF SCHEMATIC DESIGN





## **RIVER STORIES**

"The River is our origin story, and the Mississippi River valley in this location is a place of awe and grandeur."

"Yes I spent my youth fishing this area, it was an important part of developing a love of the outdoors and commitment to conservation."

"The bluffs are historically known as Imnizaska to my nation, Dakota." "The river is a place I love to visit at the various parks in St. Paul, and is someplace I love to go to find peace and relaxation."

"It is the face of downtown St. Paul."

"Currently the city turns its back on its greatest asset and most unique feature, the river bluff. Concentrating on a holistic pedestrian oriented experience would transform the downtown."

"I have a deep love and respect for the river. I grew up on the river on a boat from age six on. Every single weekend as soon as the river thawed, my family boated anywhere between Harriet Island and Lock & Dam #2."

"The history of the river and how interconnected the communities, both wildlife and human, are to these spaces are not only incredible, but also essential stories to learn and tell." Does this place have a special meaning to you?

"Yes it is spiritual, water is life and should be respected and honored. It is Indigenous Land!"

"Yes. It is my new home."

"Yes I love seeing the eagles"

"My favorite memories in St. Paul were usually those where I spent quiet moments along the trails or paths near the River, where I could bike, hike, or walk while admiring the natural beauty of the water, eagles flying overhead, and ducks or even beavers swimming."



"Yes, I'm an Indian (Asian) immigrant who used to live in South Korea close to a harbor. Visiting the river bluff and walking with my husband and toddler brought back some sort of familiarity bask from India and from South Korea. It's been 16 years and we call Saint Paul home now."

"It represents diversity and community."

"Yes, I was born in St. Paul. The river is like an artery." "Yes, grew up in STP, went to Mississippi River camp, spent time on the riverboats with grandparents, at the parks enjoying picnics and sunshine. Limited places to do this safely along the River now."

"Seeing the bluffs connects me to my family in Wabasha MN. I see the river here in St Paul and know that the same water makes its way to where my family has lived for generations."


"I grew up in St. Paul, went to high school in downtown St. Paul, and worked as a teenager at the Science Museum. The river has always been at the center of these experiences."





#### STORMWATER MANAGEMENT APPROACH

- Identify points of storm-water runoff collection and treatment and potentially re-use for irrigation and other park uses
- Identify locations that exhibit and showcase storm-water management best practices, in coordination with CRWD and other stakeholders.
- Identify 'Green Street' segments in the framework plan where stormwater management infrastructure can be incorporated.
- Provide a generously scaled dock for Viking Cruises and public realm at Lambert's Landing





# **RIVER BALCONY SCHEMATIC PLAN**





















# PRIORITY ITEMS FOR NEXT PHASE OF DESIGN

- 1. Design & Programming coordination with other development projects along River Balcony
- 2. Progressing strategies for traffic calming along the downtown stretch of Shepard Rd.
- 3. Coordination with streetscape projects in downtown St. Paul to ensure cohesive design




# RECOMMENDED PARAMETERS FOR FUTURE DEVELOPMENT & DESIGN

- Open space associated with RIver Center Ramp development to be integrated as a part of River Balcony, for programming and amenity planning.
- Direct, year round / all season ADA access to the Big Woods overlook and to thewalkway at grade to be required as a part of the development.
- Project A3 to be constructed as a part of the RIver Center Ramp developmen
- Potential maintenance partnership for Projects A1A & A1B can be considered as a prt of the development agreement

- Open space associated with RiversEdge development to be integrated as a part of River Balcony, for programming and amenity planning.
- Replacement of any River Balcony elements/ improvements due to construction of future development, along Kellogg Blvd Southern Sidewalk and to be required via instrument such as M.O.U or similar
- Overlook and Gateway features proposed at Market St and St.Peter St. to be retained and incorporated into design as development/ park gateways
- Visual corridors to be maitained at Market St and St.Peter St.

- Continued use of the County Parking lot as a flexible use open space that can be used for temporary events and programs to maintain public views and experience of the only remnant of downtown St.Pauls 'bluff'
- Any public crossing across Shepard Road, originating at Union Depot should be ADA, year round/ all season and also considered to have direct access from the street.

- 1. Basis of Design Report & Planning Commission Approval
- 2. 6-month transition period:
  - Create governance structure
  - Define partner roles and responsibilities
  - Develop finance strategy
  - Evaluate phasing timeline
